

Mutual Recognition Arrangement

Athletic Trainer/Therapist Exam Eligibility

Whereas, the Joint Task Force on Credential Recognition, having been formed in 2002 and jointly chaired by representatives of the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification, Inc. (BOC) and the Canadian Athletic Therapists Association (CATA).

And Whereas after a thorough and comprehensive review recommend to the respective policy making bodies that any individual being verified and in good standing by either the BOC or the CATA be recognized as having satisfied the eligibly requirements for examination.

And whereas it is further understood that this arrangement for recognition of credentials is for the purpose of determining eligibility to challenge each organization's examination does not in any way ensure employment of an individual who is successful on said exam.

And whereas it is understood that applicable State, Provincial and/or Federal regulations supersede this agreement.

Be it therefore resolved that the governing bodies of the BOC and the CATA hereby agree that any individual being verified and in "good standing" by either the BOC or the CATA be eligible to apply for the certification examination process of the respective association.
